Will she succeed?

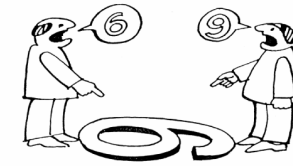
The story reveals the absurdity of war and suggests a new point of view.

Choose a topic to discuss. The objective is to look for different positions among the students. When we have it, we should ask each one to literally put themselves in the other's shoes and try to see the issue as the other sees it. Then both should move away to find a common position.

## QUESTIONS ON FEELING

- How do you feel when someone doesn't think the same as you?
- What if instead of being one person there are many who do not think the same as you?
- Do you think there is only one way of thinking?

## THE POWER OF THOUGHT

- 1.** Invite the minors to think about some sad situations that has happened to them in their lives. You must help them to recreate that situation with their eyes closed. You can invite them to see, listen and feel what they felt in that situation.
- 2.** Repeat the exercise asking them to think of a happy situation.
- 3.** Ask them to compare both situations and how they felt. The goal is for them to experience how thinking influences their emotions.
