## IN CLASSROOM

1. Make sure that the kids have understood the story shared. Some of the pupils can summarize it.
2. Organize pupils into small groups so each one creates an ending together with a drawing, a title, and a moral.
3. Each group takes turns to share their story and comment their conclusions.
4. Use questions from the teacher and pupils about the text. Open a small debate to come up with a common moral between them all.

## QUESTIONS ON FEELINGS

Why do you think Roni cried when he saw himself in the water?  
Have you had a similar feeling to what happened to Roni?  
Why did Roni do what the wolf, the ducks, and the frog suggested?  
Would you have done the same?  
Do you think there is only one way to be successful?  
How do you see yourself?

1. Write a list with all your strengths.
2. Then ask the people who know you best to tell you what they think are your strengths. You can ask your friends, family, or teachers.
3. Compare both lists and you are sure to discover things that others know about you that you weren't even aware of.
